[COVID-19 Safe Events and Activities](#)

- Standing and drinking alcohol and/or dancing is permitted in premises with a liquor licence or liquor permit up to a maximum of 1000 people in indoor spaces and 5000 people in outdoor spaces, within current density requirements.

Victoria - Melbourne

No density limits apply.

- Large indoor venues – including stadiums that have a capacity of 30,000 or more, need a one-off approval of their [COVIDSafe Plan](#) from the Victorian Government, and large outdoor events with 30,000 or more attendees need to publish their [COVIDSafe Plan](#).

Western Australia - Perth

1 person per 2sqm density limits

- 500 person capacity limit
- If 2sqm is greater than 500 people, the greater option will be permitted for events with a COVID Event Plan
