From 28 December 2021
The total number of people at a place must not exceed 3 people per 4sqm indoor and outdoor spaces

- No maximum capacity restrictions for indoor meetings provided there is a COVID Safe Plan and an average of 3 people per 4sqm (75%)
- For events of 3,000+ people a COVID Management Plan is required
- COVID marshal required for events

- 1 person per 2sqm for both indoor and outdoor events
- Indoor venues – seated ticketed venues 100% capacity with mandatory masks
- Open Stadiums – 100% seated capacity with COVID Safe Checklist

Australian Capital Territory -
Canberra

1 person per 2sqm within each indoor and outdoor space

- 1 person per 2sqm within each indoor and outdoor space
- For areas with fixed and tiered seating, 100 per cent of fixed seating capacity.
- Conference and Convention Venues – no density limits apply to outdoor spaces
- Events over 1,000 people must be ticketed or pre-registered (smaller events must use Check in CBR)
- Eating and drinking while standing is permitted.
- Exemptions will be considered for events, in accordance with the COVID-19 Safe Event Guidance (under 2,000 people) or COVID Safe Event Guidance (more than 2,000 people).
